Dr. Sherr's passion for the care of those with T1D is personal, as she was diagnosed in 1987. From the time of her diagnosis, she was determined to become a pediatric endocrinologist. While she always wanted to care for those with T1D, during her fellowship at Yale, her eyes were open to the meaningful impact that clinical research has. Dr. Sherr thus embarked on further training through the Yale Graduate School of Arts and Sciences Investigative Medicine Program, a doctoral program designed to develop the next generation of physician scientists.

Dr. Sherr has been devoted to clinical research over the past 12 years. She is an integral member of the diabetes technology team at Yale. She has conducted studies of new glucagon formulations for the treatment of severe hypoglycemia. She has worked on projects with the Type 1 Diabetes Exchange and served as the first Junior Pediatric Faculty Member to its steering committee between 2016-2018. Dr. Sherr received her degrees from Rutgers University and UMDNJ- Robert Wood Johnson Medical School.
